Where can I register for The Blade's E-edition? toledoblade.com/nie

Where can I find the daily E-edition?

You will find each day's E-edition of The Blade, available by 5:30 a.m. at **toledoblade.com/nie**

What are site licenses?

Licenses are tied to the number of different computers accessed each day under your login. Over the course of a school day an unlimited number of students may log in with your user name and password using any computer available until the number of unique computers used that day matches the number of licenses requested. The counter is reset each morning.

How do I pay for the E-edition?

You may be billed or you may request sponsorship. The cost is \$2 per license. For example, if you are registered for 35 licenses (34 students and yourself), you will be billed for \$70 for a 7-day a week, year-long subscription.

If funding is not available at your school, you may request sponsorship. Each participating teacher requesting sponsorship will be required to complete and sign an affidavit verifying that the e-editions were requested and used by students for educational purposes. Affidavits may be sent electronically. Teachers who fail to return the requested affidavit within a reasonable amount of time will lose log-in privileges for themselves and their students. If the affidavit is still outstanding at the end of the school year, your school will be billed for your e-editions.

How can I learn to use the E-edition?

Use the Classroom Edition Tutorial to help you learn to navigate the E-edition. To start the online course, fill in the requested information using the password "niecourse".

Can I print articles from the E-Edition?

Yes, you and your students can instantly research articles by key words and print the articles for classroom use.
