Quinn gets his first shot

Rookie QB leads team to field goal in lone series

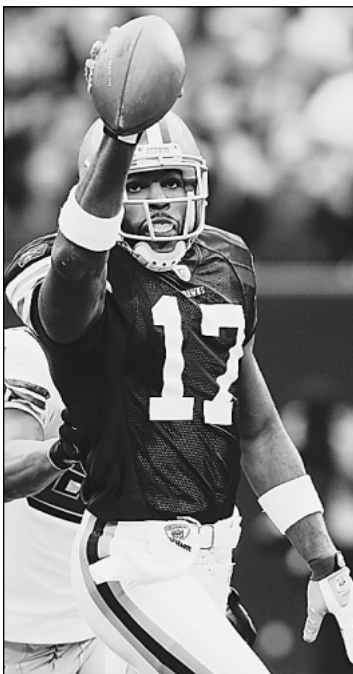
CLEVELAND — Browns fans got something they had been waiting for the entire regular season yesterday. A 10-win season was nice, sure — but Brady Quinn finally played.

A pinky finger injury to quarterback Derek Anderson forced Quinn, one of two Browns first-round draft picks in 2007, to play a series in the second quarter of Cleveland's 20-7 win over the 49ers.

Anderson said he hit his pinky on a helmet in consecutive series. He went to the locker room with numbness and discomfort in his finger, and Quinn began warming up.

By the time Quinn went in to a standing ovation with 3:11 left in the half, Anderson was already back on the sideline, but Quinn played the entire drive.

Quinn's first pass was tipped and fell incomplete, and his next pass was an incomplete screen pass. He completed his next three over the middle for 45 yards, bringing the Browns to the 49ers' 6. Quinn didn't get that first touchdown pass, though, because Kellen Winslow and Braylon Edwards dropped balls in the end zone. Phil Dawson then kicked a 23-yard field goal.

The X-rays on Anderson's pinky were negative, so he sat out just one series and returned to start the second half.

He was booed on a few plays when he threw near-miss inter-

ceptions.

Browns coach Romeo Crennel quickly waved away any speculation that with Anderson's recent struggles, Quinn could see more time.

"There is no quarterback controversy, don't try to start one," Crennel said. "[Quinn] did a good job with the chance he had."

Quinn was glad for the abbreviated experience.

"I think it's incredibly valuable, one week away from the playoffs," Quinn said. "If I had gotten in in week six it wouldn't have been the same."

Quinn received positive reviews for his short stint from his offensive teammates.

"He stepped in and took control of the huddle," Winslow said.

Anderson said his finger bothered him in the second half, but that if the Browns made the playoffs it would not be a problem. He asked to return in the second half.

"We kissed it and rubbed a little aspirin on it," Crennel said of his QB's finger.

WEINKE STARTS: The 49ers' Chris Weinke became the 63rd quarterback to start in the NFL this season. A former Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State,

he had not played in the NFL in more than a year. Weinke was the fourth quarterback to start for San Francisco this year.

The 49ers signed Weinke, 35, on Dec. 12, but this past week was the first time he had practiced with the first-team offense.

Weinke completed 13-of-22 passes for 104 yards and a touchdown.

He relied heavily on Frank Gore, who rushed 23 times for 94 yards.

"I thought he did a good job on such short notice," 49ers coach Mike Nolan said. "He completed some big passes and made some plays. He commanded the huddle well."

EXTRA POINTS: New Browns defensive end Bobby Hamilton started in place of Orpheus Roye. Hamilton, a 13-year pro, was signed by the Browns on Wednesday. ... The Browns allowed just 19 sacks this season, the lowest since returning to the NFL in 1999. ... Winslow had 1,106 receiving yards, the third-best single-season total in team history. ... Joshua Cribbs' 135 punt return yards were the second most in a game by a Browns player, just behind Eric Metcalf's 166 yards in 1993 against Pittsburgh.

Brown's 126 in 1965.

A six-yard run in the first quarter gave Jamal Lewis 9,000 career rushing yards. In his eighth season, Lewis, 28, became the 26th NFL running back to achieve the milestone.

Lewis, who had his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season with 128 yards, finished the year with 1,304 yards, the only Browns running back other than Brown to go over 1,300 yards in a season.

Derek Anderson's 45-yard strike to Edwards gave him 29 touchdown passes for the season, tied for second in team history.

The Browns players said they felt they belong in the playoffs.

"We're one of the best offenses in the NFL," Edwards said. "Our defense has been playing lights out for the last four or five weeks. We deserve to be in there. I tell you what, we better not make it because if we do, some people are going to have some problems with us. I guarantee you that."

The Browns scored first on Cribbs' 76-yard punt return for a touchdown late in the first quarter. Cribbs made the Pro Bowl based on his kick returns and special teams play, but this was his first career punt return for a score.

The first 49ers blocker missed, and Cribbs sprinted up the middle into a wide opening. He was untouched except for punter Andy Lee, who dived for his feet inside the 10, but Cribbs hopped over and trotted in.

Cribbs also had a 53-yard punt return in the first quarter. In the third, he returned a kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown only to have it called back because of a holding penalty on Lennie Friedman. And on the other end, he had four special teams tackles, often holding the 49ers to measly returns.

"He is a return machine as well as a tackle machine," Crennel said. "They couldn't block him."

"When I see them kick it deep to him, I'm excited. He has that kind of determination that he wants to make something happen."

Collins, Bironas lift Titans past Colts

INDIANAPOLIS — Kerry Collins spent most of the season waiting for a chance to prove he could still play.

Last night, with a playoff spot at stake, Tennessee's backup quarterback delivered the biggest win of the season.

He led the Titans to three second-half field goals, including a 54-yarder from Rob Bironas to retake the lead in a 16-10 victory that left Tennessee celebrating and Cleveland grimacing. The Titans visit San Diego on Sunday.

The Titans (10-6) had to win to make the playoffs for the first time since 2003. A loss would have given Cleveland its first playoff berth since 2002.

And when Peyton Manning left after two series, things looked good for the Titans.

Instead, the offense bogged down after a touchdown drive on the game's opening series. When Vince Young left in the third quarter with a right quadriiceps injury, Tennessee appeared to be in trouble.

Collins replaced Young in the middle of a 13-play, 56-yard drive that ended with Bironas' tying 40-yard field goal late in the third quarter.

"That's life as a backup. You never know when you'll go in," Collins said. "I hope Vince is all right."

He moved the Titans 58 yards in 12 plays, setting up Bironas for the go-ahead field goal. He then sealed the win with a 33-yarder with 2:56 to go.

Colts coach Tony Dungy used the game as a tuneup for Indy's playoff opener Jan. 13, benching most of his offensive starters after two series and his defensive starters in the second half.

But Manning and Reggie Wayne played just long enough to reach milestones.

Manning entered the game needing 55 yards to extend his NFL record of most 4,000-yard seasons to eight. That took one series.

Pro Bowl receiver Wayne needed eight catches to become the second Colt with 100 receptions in a season. That took two series.

Wayne also needed 71 yards to pass Randy Moss for the league title in yards receiving. He did that on Indy's third series.
