While several construction projects in the Toledo area are nearing completion, a couple of new ones start next week - most notably a nine-day detour for a

ramp at the I-75/I-475 junction near Perrysburg.

Starting at 5 a.m. Tuesday, the northbound I-75 exit to northbound I-475 will be closed while its current asphalt pavement is removed and replaced with concrete. Traffic will be detoured to the U.S. 20/23 interchange to reverse direction back to I-475. Nighttime lane closings will occur on the ramp from southbound I-475 to northbound I-75.

The work is scheduled for completion Sept. 20, but that date is subject to suitable weather conditions, and Toledo motorists already have seen how weather has pushed back completion dates for several other local projects.

On Tuesday only, the right lane of southbound I-75 will be closed at Bays Road, south of Bowling Green, for bridge repairs. On Wednesday only, the northbound right lane will be closed at two bridges between North Baltimore and Bowling Green. Both of those closings will be from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m.


In Monroe County, a concrete repair and joint sealing program on I-75 begins Tuesday, covering the sections between the Ohio border and Monroe and between I-275 and Rockwood. Mich. Work on the \$400,000 maintenance project is scheduled to end Nov. 1.

Single-lane closings will occur at varying locations through the work area during daytime hours, which should cause only minor delays, but double-lane closings at night and on weekends could cause major backups. MDOT says it will post advisory signs in advance of the double-lane

1. I-280: Closed for bridge construction, Greenbelt Parkway to Summit Street, until November. Through traffic detour via I-75, State Rt. 795. Summit, closed in both directions at I-280, is scheduled to reopen tomorrow.

At I-280, Front Street is restricted to one lane each way with turn restrictions. The Front entrance to southbound I-280 is closed for reconstruction until Sept. 30.

2. U.S. 23: Bridge rehabilitation closes one lane each way north of I-475. Northbound reopening



is expected by Sunday.

3. Byrne Road: Bridge reconstruction and road rebuilding closes lanes north of Airport Highway and south of Tedrow

4. State Rt. 420: Interchange construction at U.S. 20/23 closes lanes south of Truman Road. Traffic shifts on U.S. 20/23.

5. I-475/U.S. 23. State Rt. 25: Finishing work on bridge rehabilitation requires lane closings on the routes between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.

6. State Rt. 184 (Alexis Road), I-75: Bridge reconstruction closes lanes on Alexis near I-75 until October. The southbound I-75 entrance and northbound I-75 exit at Alexis are expected to reopen today.

7. State Rt. 582: Closed for culvert work at Liberty Hi Road until October. Detour via State Rts. 64 and 65.

8. Monroe Street: A repaving project requires lane closings west of U.S. 23 in downtown

9. State Rt. 2 (Airport Highway): Widening work between Byrne and Reynolds roads requires flag zones. Use South Avenue or Glendale Avenue.

10. State Rt. 2: Two-way traffic is maintained in a work area at the Bono curve, but watch for stopped vehicles making turns. Several side roads are closed.

11. Ohio Turnpike: Bridge widening between I-280 and I-75 may require lane closings. Glenwood and Cummings roads and East Broadway are closed at the turnpike.

12. State Rt. 51 (Monroe Street): Reconstruction requires lane closings between Lawrence and Detroit avenues. Lawrence is closed to through traffic between Bancroft and Monroe streets.

13. Secor Road: Pavement rehabilitation closes the southbound lanes between Kenwood Boulevard and Bancroft Street until late this month. Use Douglas Road instead.

14. Anthony Wayne Bridge (State Rts. 2/51/65): Maintenance requires lane closings from 6 p.m. Friday through 5 a.m. Monday.

15. Telegraph Road (U.S. 24): Closes Monday for bridge replacement between Fast Laskey and Crabb roads. Detour via Crabb and East Laskey until Nov. 30.

16. Holland-Sylvania Road: Sewer work closes the northbound lanes at Angola Road for one week, starting Monday. Detour via Angola, Reynolds Road, and Hill Avenue.

Nursing home vote stands

Hillsdale bond issue recounted after narrow Aug. 8 passage

HILLSDALE — The decision to go ahead with an \$8 million nursing home bond issue, passed by voters on Aug. 8 by 49 votes, still stands after a two-day recount.

Eleven people sorted the 6,952 ballots by hand

at the Hillsdale County Courthouse on Tuesday and reviewed and certified the official recount numbers yesterday. They found four additional "yes" votes and five additional "no" votes — bringing

the tally to 3,500 to 3,452, according to County Clerk Thomas Mohr. Douglas Stewart, a salesman who lives in Litchfield, paid \$250 for the recount of votes from

Mr. Stewart, who paid \$10 for the recount in each of the county's 25 precincts, posted his feelings about the bond issue on a Hillsdale Internet public forum and quickly raised the money through an Internet payment account he set up to accept donations.

He questioned the 160-bed, countyowned nursing home's plan to convert 48 rooms into private rooms, repair the boiler, and other renovations.

Mr. Mohr, who became county clerk in 1985, said this is the first time he has performed a recount for every precinct. He said it seems the optical scanner didn't read

the nine newly found ballots because voters had
