




New Year's Raffle — Billed as "your best odds to win 1 million dollars," the Ohio Lottery is selling tickets now for a special Jan. 2 drawing, with four winners taking home \$1 million. Another 10 winners will be awarded \$10,000, with an additional 3,320 people winning cash prizes ranging from \$100-\$1,500. Available wherever lottery tickets are sold. Each ticket costs \$20.



Bicycle automatic card shuffler — This automatic card shuffler shuffles one or two decks of playing cards with the touch of a button. It's a great aid for those who have trouble shuffling by hand and also prevents your sneaky friends from stacking the deck. The device requires one 9-volt battery, which is not included. friends at the poker table every Saturday night and think you're up to the task, then pony up \$10,000 for a buy-in at the World Series of Poker Main Event. Held annually in Las Vegas, the World Series of Poker attracted more than 75,000 entrants from 105 countries last year competing for \$191,999,010 over the 58-event, 50day extravaganza. The Main Event is the culminating event at the World Series of Poker held every November with a prize pool of \$64,531,000 in 2011. Of the 6,865 who entered last year, 693 players cashed in the event with a payout of \$19,359 for 693rd place.
