L is for... **Lambertville**. The Michigan hometown of defenseman Phil Rauch.

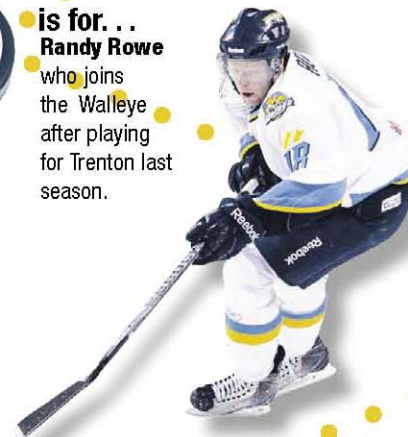
N is for... **Napoli**. Joe Napoli, the president and general manager of the Walleye.



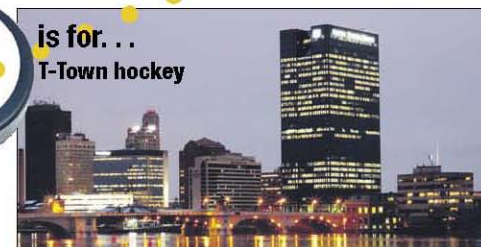

T is for... **T-Town hockey**



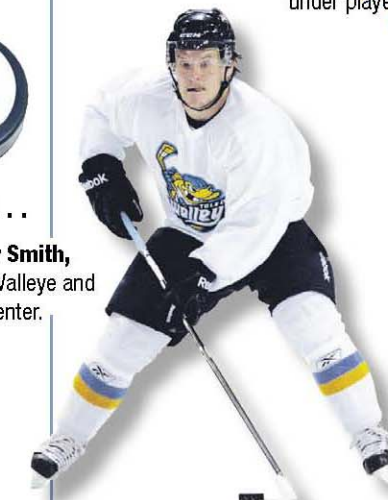
O is for... **Opening Night**. The first game of the season is Saturday, Oct. 13 as the Walleye host Kalamazoo.
