ning percentage came 11 City League championships in 15 title-game appearances, nine district titles and five trips to the state semifinals, the last of which, in 1990, ended with a Division I championship.

"I always looked at it as our opportunity to have a reflection on the school and the kids," Williams says today. "I still look at it that way. I'm proud of what we did because it was helpful to so many young people and it was a positive reflection on the school and the community."

Williams retired from teaching and coaching after the 1997-98 season, and promptly received the honor of having the Scott gym renamed the Ben E. Williams Field House. Shortly thereafter he was inducted into the Ohio High School Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Heintschel, in his 25th season as the head coach at St. John's Jesuit, takes a 429-139 (.755) career mark into his team's league game at 6:30 tonight at Savage Hall against Start. The Titans are tied with Libbey and Scott, who meet at 8:30 p.m. at Savage, for first place, all with 7-1 league records.

St. John's earned its coach win No. 429 with a 77-44 triumph against Scott last Friday. "I think we've both run very disciplined programs in a number of ways," Heintschel said. "Our players conformed to what we wanted, and we had to reign in some great players and get them to play team ball. We were both tough enough to do that, and therefore the kids maximized as a team. That was really important."

"I'm honored and humbled to be in the same spot [429 wins] he is. He set a very high standard in terms of quality of basketball. To even be in that ballpark at all is humbling. He still has a better percentage, and that's good."

Heintschel's coaching resume includes nine City League championships in 13 title-game trips, eight district crowns and three advancements to the state semifinals. His Titans, during a run of seven consecutive 20-win seasons, finished as Division-I state runners-up in 1993 and '96, and fell in the semifinals last season.

The careers of the men, easily recognized on the local sports scene as simply "Ben" and "Ed," overlapped for 19 competitive seasons. Williams' teams dominated for most of the first 11 years (15-2), and Heintschel's squads held a 7-5 edge over the final eight. Williams retired with a 20-9 advantage.

Williams and Heintschel may have begun their City League rivalry as two coaches just trying to win games, but ended it sharing a mutual respect because of their roles in a series of hard-fought but clean battles by their teams. Those games
